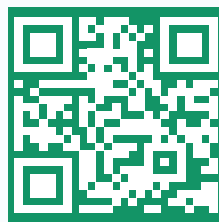

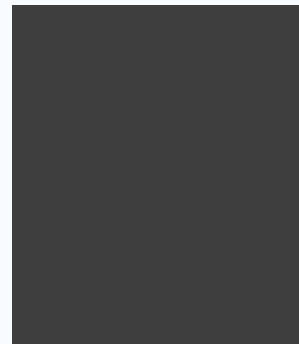

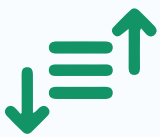
## Heritage of Establishment

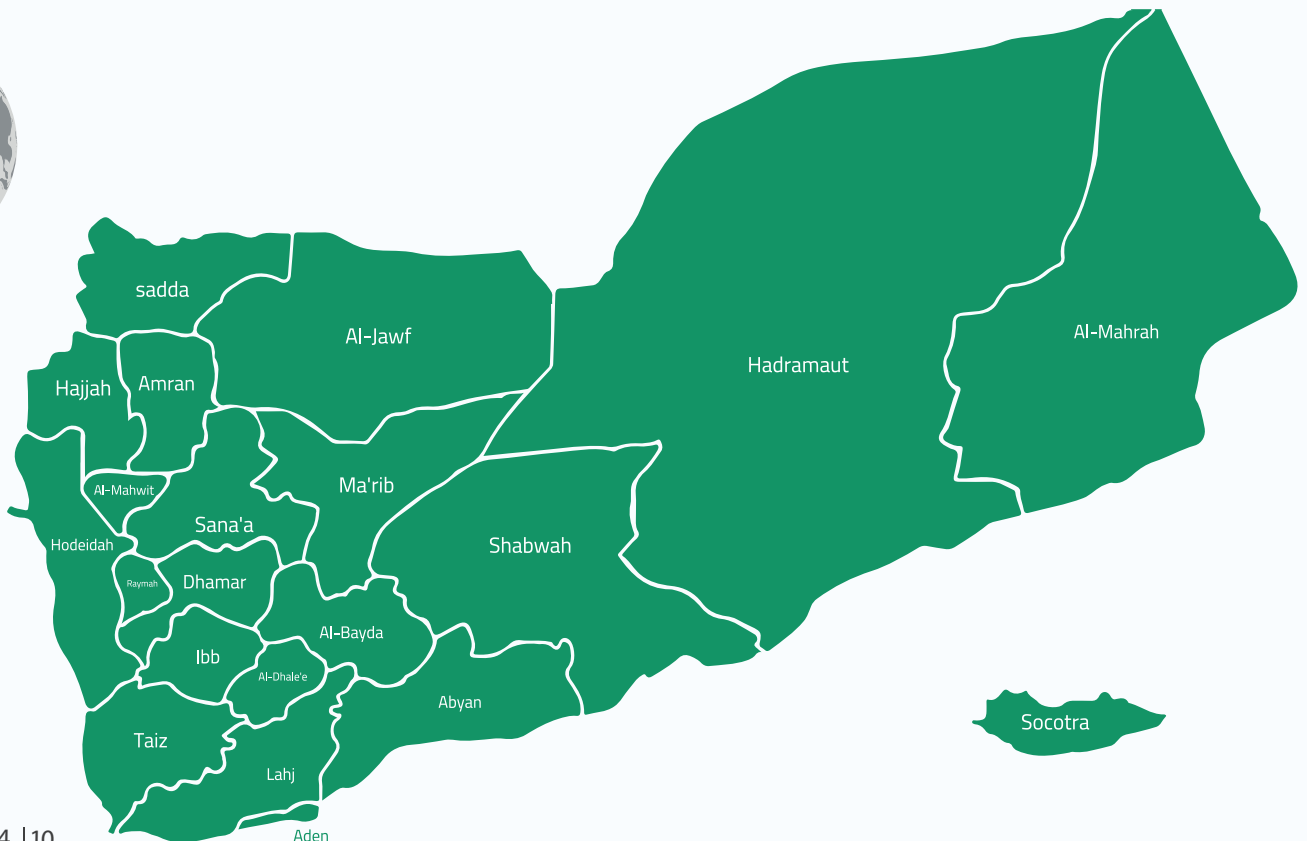

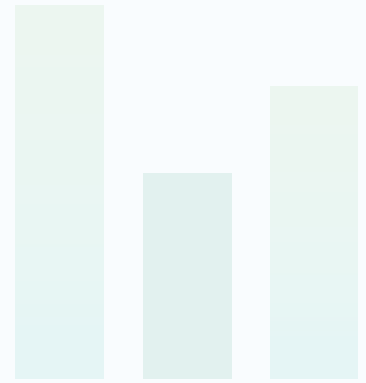

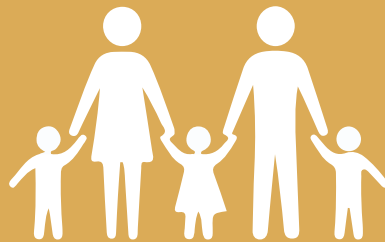

## Food Assistance

### A Glimmer of Hope Amidst Suffering: A Story of Struggle in the Heart of Taiz - Fatima Ali

Fatima Ali, 43, found herself alone facing harsh burdens after the death of her husband, the family's sole breadwinner. She was suddenly thrust into the grave responsibility of securing food for her five children, completely lacking any steady source of income. Meanwhile, donations from charitable people came only sporadically, leaving the family's fate hanging in the wind.

Fatima, who lives in a neighborhood in the Al-Qahirah district of Taiz Governorate, describes the bitterness of their life: "The world turned dark for me with my husband's passing; my children would cry for food while we didn't even have our daily sustenance. Our days were filled with pain, and I could do nothing but weep in the face of a helplessness that was gnawing at my heart."

As the crisis in Yemen intensified, the family's options narrowed, and hunger directly threatened their lives. She confirms this, saying: "Many long nights passed for me and my children without tasting any food. I sold my simple household belongings to cover...

... our needs, and debts piled up until I could no longer repay them, and I could no longer borrow from anyone.

In the heart of this critical situation, Al-Noor Charity Association intervened through the "Assisting Vulnerable Families Project," serving as a lifeline for this struggling family. The project provided regular food assistance, including essential commodities such as flour, oil, and legumes, which directly contributed to the family's ability to endure and survive.

Commenting on this vital support that changed the course of their lives, Fatima said: "You saved me and my children from the danger of hunger. Thanks to your provision of these basic supplies, the specter of deprivation no longer haunts us daily. Without this project, I wouldn't have been able to secure food for my children. Today, thanks to God, our situation has become more stable.



# 1- Relief and Food Care

Food assistance is at the forefront of Al-Noor Charity Association’s priorities, especially during these challenging times in Yemen. With alarming levels of food insecurity and a growing population in need of aid due to the consequences of conflict and climate change, efforts supported by partners in 2024 have reached more than 6,000 individuals. Beneficiaries received essential food supplies—primarily flour, ghee, sugar, and rice—alongside ready-to-eat meals and cash assistance to cover basic needs and respond to immediate crises.

This vital assistance targeted those in dire need of humanitarian aid, representing a victory for fundamental human rights—most importantly the right to food. Furthermore, these efforts contribute to achieving the second Goal of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 2): Zero Hunger.

## 2 - Ramadan Food Projects

Driven by its humanitarian responsibility toward the most vulnerable groups, Al-Noor Charity Association has consistently implemented "Ramadan Charity Projects." With extensive experience in managing these seasonal initiatives, the association contributes significantly to alleviating the burdens on those in need. These projects include the distribution of food baskets, organizing Iftar tables, and providing ready-to-eat meals, dates, meat, and Zakat Al-Fitr. The goal is to inspire hope among the poor and needy during the Holy Month and to bring joy and happiness to the homes of deserving families.

Through the support of generous donors during the year 1445 AH - 2024 AD, these projects reached more than 8,000 beneficiaries in Yemen. This achievement is a vital milestone amidst numerous living crises, most notably the high rise in general price levels. Many beneficiaries expressed their deep gratitude to Al-Noor Association and its funders, noting that this generous aid helped transform the month of Ramadan into a season of joy and worship.

### 3- Qurbani Project

As Yemen remains one of the world’s poorest countries, access to red meat—a vital nutritional source—has become increasingly out of reach for a vast segment of the population. Even the Adha sacrifice is no longer an accessible annual tradition for many, rendered unattainable by skyrocketing prices and deteriorating living and economic conditions.

Consequently, Sacrificial Meat Distribution projects represent a crucial opportunity to support families facing extreme hardship, enabling them to share the joy of this blessed religious occasion with the rest of the community. Thanks to the generosity of donors and the dedicated efforts of Al-Noor Charity Association, more than half a million vulnerable individuals were able to have meat during the days of Eid Al-Adha, transforming their holiday into a time of true joy and happiness.

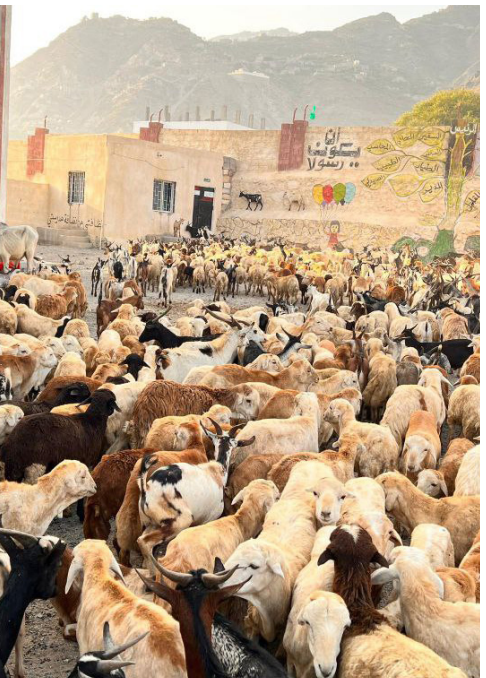

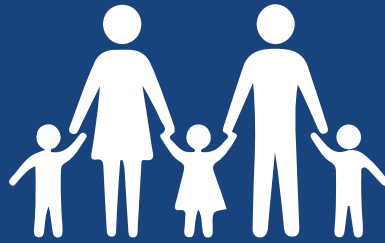

## A New Dawn of Health

### Vision Restored After Darkness: «Safaa» Regains the Sight of Life

For years, "Safaa" lived in a bitter struggle with failing vision, which intensified until it obscured the features of life and its beautiful details. Cataracts isolated her from her world; her steps within her own home became filled with caution and confusion after she lost the ability to see her children's faces clearly.

Recalling those days of darkness, Safaa describes her suffering: "My vision was fading day by day until I was living in a permanent fog. It wasn't the loss of sight itself that pained me the most, but rather my inability to fulfill my duties toward my family and the feeling that I had become a burden on them while still in the prime of my youth."

Given the dire living conditions her family faced, covering the costs of eye surgery was an impossible dream, leaving her hope of restoring her sight deferred indefinitely.

Amid real fears of permanent vision loss, a new window of hope opened for "Safaa" with the launch of the "Eye Surgery Project" implemented by Al-Noor Charity Association. She underwent a successful surgery to remove the cataracts and receive a lens implant, as part of the specialized medical assistance the project provides to underprivileged and needy families.

Today, Safaa has bid farewell to years of darkness and returned to her daily life with vitality.

Reflecting on this unforgettable moment with a radiant smile, she says:


"By the grace of God and thanks to this project, my sight and my soul have been restored. Seeing my children clearly today is the greatest gift I have ever received. I am deeply grateful to Al-Noor Association for bringing back the light and restoring stability to my life."





# 1- Ophthalmological Surgery Projects

Eye surgeries and blindness prevention stand at the forefront of Al-Noor Charity Association’s priorities, especially given the severe challenges facing Yemen’s healthcare sector. This comes amid alarming rates of preventable eye diseases and a growing population unable to afford specialized surgical costs due to the ongoing conflict and economic crises.

Through the unwavering support of our partners, efforts implemented consistently throughout 2024 have benefited hundreds of individuals who underwent specialized surgeries—primarily cataract removal and lens implantation. These services, along with free medical examinations and the provision of essential medications, ensured comprehensive medical care for patients year-round. These medical interventions serve as vital aid targeting the most vulnerable groups—those who lost their ability to work or lead normal lives due to vision impairment or loss. The sustained regularity of this project represents a triumph for fundamental human rights, foremost the right to healthcare, granting individuals the hope to regain their independence and reintegrate into society.

## 2- Cholera Outbreak Response Project

The Cholera Control Project is one of the most prominent emergency health interventions adopted by Al-Noor Charity Association, aimed at curbing the spread of the epidemic and containing infection hotspots in the most vulnerable areas. This project comes as a response to the significant health challenges facing the country, ensuring the provision of immediate medical care to those infected to reduce mortality rates and complications.

The project's main pillars and objectives include:

- Curative Care: Providing treatment, intravenous (IV) fluids, and necessary vaccines to patients through specialized centers.
- Medical Support: Supplying essential medical equipment and medications to health facilities to ensure service continuity.
- Periodic Response: Project activities were implemented regularly and consistently throughout 2024 to ensure full readiness to face any sudden outbreaks.
- Awareness and Prevention: Raising health awareness regarding transmission methods and prevention, alongside distributing sterilization and personal hygiene kits.

These efforts represent a fundamental pillar in community protection, targeting hundreds of cases that lacked access to urgent healthcare. The project's success embodies the Association's commitment to protecting the human right to health and life, actively contributing to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly the goal related to public health and combating infectious epidemics.

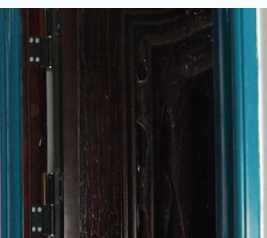

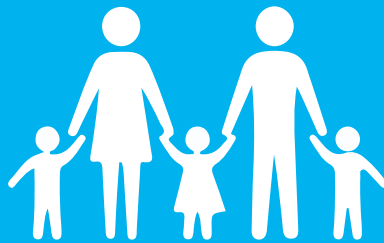

## A Lifeline

# Water Tank Project for Al-Hubaishi School and Orphanage for Care and Rehabilitation

“We used to worry about every single drop of water; today, we see hope flowing in our hands.” With these words, the administration of Al-Hubaishi School and Orphanage for Care and Rehabilitation expressed their joy at the completion of the new water tank project, which ended an era of daily struggle in securing clean water. Approximately 1,000 students and orphans, who reside at the home or benefit from its educational services, faced significant challenges in accessing sufficient water for drinking and daily use. This directly impacted their health and educational environment, while placing a heavy operational and financial burden on the administration to provide water through costly and unsustainable water trucks. Recognizing that orphan care is at the forefront of its priorities, Al-Noor Charity Association initiated the construction and equipping of a strategic water tank for the home. Based on a precise engineering study designed to meet growing needs, this project was implemented as part of...

the home’s strategic water tank, based on a precise engineering study designed to meet growing demands. This intervention was carried out under the “Suqia Al-Amal” (Water of Hope) Project, as part of the periodic implementation of water projects throughout 2024. In a celebration filled with joy, the project was officially inaugurated—an event described by the home’s administration as a “historic achievement.” This project ensures the sustainable supply of water for sanitation facilities, kitchens, and the personal needs of the orphans around the clock. Social figures and relevant stakeholders in attendance praised the intervention, emphasizing that the project is more than just a concrete tank; it is a vital health and environmental safety net for these children. One of the home’s supervisors remarked: “You have restored vitality to this institution and guaranteed a dignified life and a safe, healthy environment for our orphans. From us, and from every child here, we offer our sincerest prayers and gratitude.





# 1- Water Projects & Water Sustainability Enhancement


As part of Al-Noor Charity Association's commitment to achieving Sustainable Development Goal 6 (SDG 6), we continue our diligent efforts to ensure access to clean water and sanitation for the most vulnerable communities. Driven by our belief that access to water is a fundamental human right, these projects provide radical solutions to the suffering of residents in areas facing acute water scarcity and deteriorating infrastructure caused by ongoing crises and climate change. Through the grace of God and the support of our generous donors and funding partners, the Association has successfully implemented specialized interventions, including:

- Drilling and equipping artesian wells and powering them with solar energy systems
- Rehabilitating and maintaining dilapidated water networks to ensure supply reaches every household
- Training community committees and volunteers on managing and conserving water resources
- Launching awareness and educational campaigns to reduce waterborne diseases.

By the grace of God, these efforts reached thousands of beneficiaries throughout 2024, contributing to alleviating the burdens on families and securing safe, sustainable water sources for future generations.

## 2- Water Relief (Suqia)


In light of the escalating water crisis gripping the country due to climate change and environmental degradation, Al-Noor Charity Association places "Water Relief" projects at the forefront of its priorities. Through these interventions, we aim to provide safe and clean water to residential clusters in the most deprived and needy areas, in response to the urgent humanitarian appeal.


### Tangible Achievements and Sustainable Impact

By the grace of God, and through fruitful partnerships with donors and international partners, our projects achieved concrete results during 2024, including: Securing access to safe drinking water for over 79,000 people, directly improving their quality of life - Alleviating the significant financial burdens that impoverished families previously endured to obtain water - Distributing chlorine purification tablets to more than 42,000 beneficiaries to ensure water safety during storage and household use - Reducing health risks and preventing the spread of epidemics associated with contaminated water and pathogens.

We at Al-Noor Association take pride in these field achievements that restore hope to families, and we highly value the support of our funders, without whom these challenges would not have been transformed into stories of success and continuous relief.

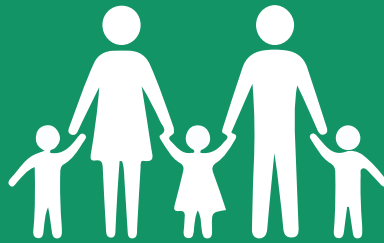

## From a Fragile Tent to a Life of Dignity and Stability

After years of bitter displacement, enduring the scorching summer sun and the freezing winter cold in dilapidated tents that offered no protection, the life of Abu Muhammad and his family of seven has finally changed. The burden was heavy; the camp lacked even the most basic necessities of life, making education and healthcare distant dreams for his children.

Doha Al-Khair Village: An Integrated Community Preserving Dignity

By the grace of God, Al-Noor Charity Association inaugurated an integrated residential units project in Doha Al-Khair Village. This project was not just about building walls; it was about creating a safe community that includes:

Modern Housing Units: Providing privacy and dignity for displaced families - A School: Ensuring children return to their desks to build their futures - A Medical Clinic: Offering primary healthcare to the residents - A Mosque: Serving as the spiritual and social heart of the village, along with a source of clean water.

Abu Muhammad says: "Only today do I feel that my children have a small homeland in Doha Al-Khair Village. The school is right next to us, and water is available. We no longer fear the winds that used to tear down our tent. Thank you to Al-Noor Charity Association, to everyone who contributed to the success of this project, and to everyone who helped protect our privacy and brought us back to life."



# 1- Rural Villages: A Sustainable Approach to Housing and Empowerment

stability. Believing that the right to adequate housing is the foundation of human dignity, Doha Al-Khair Village stands as a radical and comprehensive solution to end the tragedy faced by families in dilapidated displacement camps, providing them with a safe environment that protects them from climate fluctuations and preserves their privacy.

By the grace of God, the Association has succeeded in establishing the foundations of an integrated community in Doha Al-Khair Village, through the implementation of construction and developmental interventions, including:

- Establishment of Educational and Health Facilities: Operating a school and a medical clinic within the village to ensure effortless access to essential services
- Provision of Sustainable Infrastructure: Creating an integrated system for safe drinking water supply and sanitation facilities
- Creation of Social and Spiritual Spaces: Building a mosque that represents the vibrant heart of the village and a center for community cohesion.

Through these efforts, hundreds of families were successfully transitioned from a state of displacement to stability in 2024, restoring hope for women and children and providing a fertile environment to build a bright future for coming generations in their "small homeland."

## 2- Emergency Relief: Rapid Response for Safeguarding Human Dignity

Within the framework of Al-Noor Charity Association's commitment to its humanitarian responsibility towards accelerating crises, we work through emergency relief projects to provide a first line of defense for those affected. Believing that speed of response is the difference between suffering and stability, these interventions aim to rescue families ravaged by disasters and crises, ensuring they are not left to face the unknown alone during their hardest times.

By the grace of God, the Association has been able to activate rapid response teams and implement specialized field interventions, including:

Distribution of Integrated Food Baskets: To meet the immediate nutritional needs of displaced and affected families - Provision of Shelter and Non-Food Items (NFIs): Carrying out precise field monitoring to ensure aid reaches those truly in need in a timely manner.

Through these efforts in 2024, the severity of crises was alleviated for thousands of families, preventing the escalation of humanitarian conditions and helping affected communities build resilience and overcome the danger phase with dignity and safety.

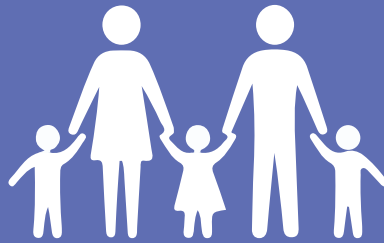

## «We don't just build walls; we build human lives.» From the desolation of loss to the horizons of creativity: The story of «Mohammad» at Al-Rahimoun Orphanage

With features shrouded in shyness and carrying an old school bag, 10-year-old “Mohammad” arrived at the gates of Al-Rahimoun Orphanage. He rarely spoke; he had left behind a small village and the harsh memories of his father’s passing—the man who had meant the entire world to him. In his early days, Mohammad preferred to sit alone in a corner of the courtyard, watching the other children play as if he were a stranger to their world. The social supervisor at the home recalls: “The biggest challenge with Mohammad wasn’t providing three meals or a warm bed; it was uprooting the fear from his eyes. He always felt like a temporary guest, waiting for another moment of departure.” Through the care plan periodically implemented by Al-Noor Charity Association throughout 2024, the work with Mohammad began step by step. It wasn’t merely financial sponsorship; it was an integrated system—ranging from providing a neat school uniform that made him feel equal to his peers, to psychological support sessions that helped him overcome the trauma of loss.

The turning point began during the “evening study circle,” when one of the teachers noticed Mohammad’s extraordinary talent in mathematics. He was encouraged and given the role of “Teacher’s Assistant” for his younger peers. This simple responsibility was enough to restore his self-confidence; for the first time in years, Mohammad felt influential and needed. Today, if you visit Al-Rahimoun, you will find Mohammad at the forefront of the students, laughing heartily and participating in organizing sports activities. He is no longer that introverted child; instead, he has become the “big brother” to many of the new orphans. The supervisor says with a smile: “The most beautiful moment was when Mohammad came to ask me, ‘Can I help the new student? He looks scared, just like I was on my first day.’ That was when we realized we had truly succeeded.” Mohammad’s story is a living example of thousands of stories witnessed by Al-Noor Charity Association, where donations are transformed from mere figures in bank accounts into real laughter and a future being built, step by step.

## 1- Orphanage-Based Child Sponsorship

In line with Al-Noor Charity Association's pursuit of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), we continue our diligent work to ensure the continuity of comprehensive care for orphaned children. Believing that a child's right to a safe environment is fundamental, these projects provide radical solutions to the suffering of orphans in care centers that face resource and infrastructure challenges due to ongoing crises and difficult economic conditions.

By the grace of God, and with the support of our giving partners, donors, and funders, the Association has successfully sponsored 3 orphanages. These qualitative interventions included:

Sustainable Shelter: Rehabilitating and maintaining housing facilities and equipping them with all necessary supplies to ensure a dignified and safe living environment - Food and Health Security: Providing periodic and preventive medical care services for the children - Educational Empowerment: Sponsoring school seats and providing school bags, in addition to educational reinforcement programs to ensure academic excellence - Psychosocial Support: Implementing recreational activities and counseling sessions to enhance mental health and social integration for children.

Through these efforts in 2024, hundreds of children were reached, alleviating the burdens on care centers and nurturing an educated generation capable of contributing to the future building of society.





## 2- Umrah Project


As part of Al-Noor Charity Association's efforts to enhance social solidarity and provide moral and spiritual care for the most vulnerable groups, we continue to implement the "Taysir Umrah" (Umrah Facilitation) program, dedicated to the elderly and the underprivileged. Believing that visiting the Holy House of Allah is a dream cherished by many, this initiative aims to remove financial and physical barriers for those who have spent their lives in giving, offering them a comprehensive spiritual experience that preserves their dignity and fulfills their aspirations. Our Achievements in the Field:

By the grace of Allah, and with the support of generous donors and funding partners, the Association has successfully provided high-quality logistical services, including:

Essential Services: Covering all costs for visas, flight tickets, and premium hotel accommodations near the Two Holy Mosques to ensure ease of movement - Health Care and Accompaniment: Providing a specialized medical team and qualified companions to assist the elderly in performing their rituals and ensure their safety throughout the journey - Comfortable Transportation: Utilizing modern transportation equipped with amenities to alleviate the hardships of travel for the pilgrims - Guidance Programs: Organizing lectures and awareness sessions to explain the Umrah rituals in a simplified manner, ensuring the proper performance of the rites.

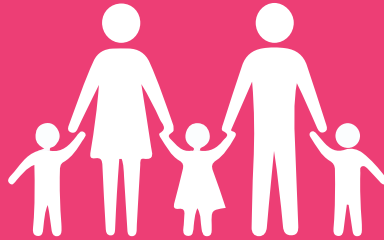

### 3 - Value-Based Character Building & Holy Quran Memorization Program

Value Development Programs: Integrating moral and behavioral curricula within the circles to promote values such as honesty, integrity, and respect for others, translating Quranic teachings into practical life skills -

Nurturing Educational Environment: Providing well-equipped and organized facilities to ensure student comfort and safety, while employing modern motivational methods to make learning an inspiring experience -

Monitoring & Evaluation: Implementing a periodic follow-up system to measure progress in memorization and behavioral development, alongside organizing regular competitions to encourage excellence and creativity.

By the grace of Allah and your support, these circles contribute to fortifying youth against destructive ideas and graduating a generation that possesses both academic sobriety and moral balance, serving as righteous building blocks for their community and nation.

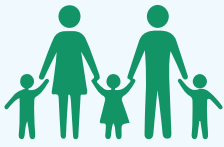

**Activating Social Roles:** Designing mosques to serve as educational and social centers for local residents by hosting awareness seminars, educational circles, and community solidarity programs.

**Operational Sustainability:** Seeking to equip mosques with solar energy systems to ensure continuous lighting and services while reducing long-term operational costs.

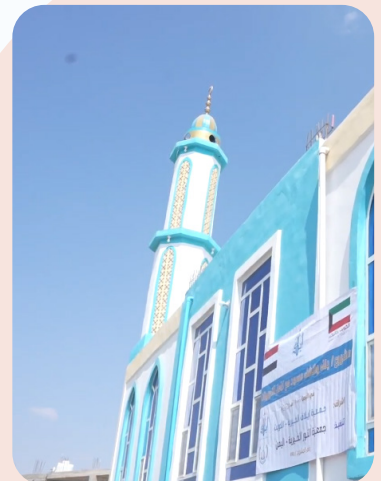
